The Mariposa Museum & History Center represents an authentic picture of people and life in Mariposa County from the migration of its first inhabitants through the Indian and Spanish periods, to the famed California Gold Rush and recent past.

For school field trips and tours, we often provide a catered experience with a focus on California History & the California Gold Rush period.

Indoor Exhibits

Within the Mariposa Museum and History Center, we represent Mariposa County History from its early



Native American inhabitants and Spanish and Mexican influences, to the beginning of the Gold Rush era through

the early 20th century.



Museum Grounds

Tour the Museum Grounds and discover our gardens, browse through mining artifacts, see the old Carriage House and Broom Shop, and enter the **U-ma-cha**, a

bark house constructed by local Native Americans.

Gold Panning



Each student is given a lesson in Gold Panning and has the opportunity to keep the gold they successfully pan.



Miwuk Exhibit History and culture of the local Miwuk are represented through artwork, basketry, and artifacts. The Southern Miwuk tribe originated in the Mariposa/Madera County area of the Sierra foothills, with historical ties to Yosemite Valley.

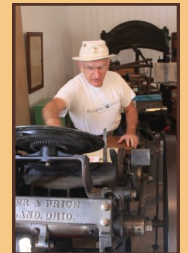


Counts House

Built by Augustus Shriver in the 1870s, this home is furnished with period furniture, utensils and clothing .

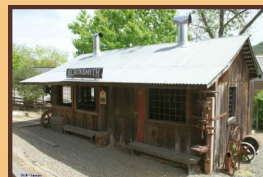
Gazette Building

The Gazette Building was moved from its original location to the Mariposa Museum in 1991. It houses two of its original printing presses, cases of type, and printing equipment. Guided tours from our resident printing expert are available.



5 Stamp Mill Live Demonstration

The five stamp mill (pictured on front page) was used to crush ore (quartz) into sand-sized particles, releasing gold from the quartz. Each stamp weighs 1,000 pounds.



Blacksmith Shop

Demonstrated in a fully functional recreation of an early Blacksmith Shop.
